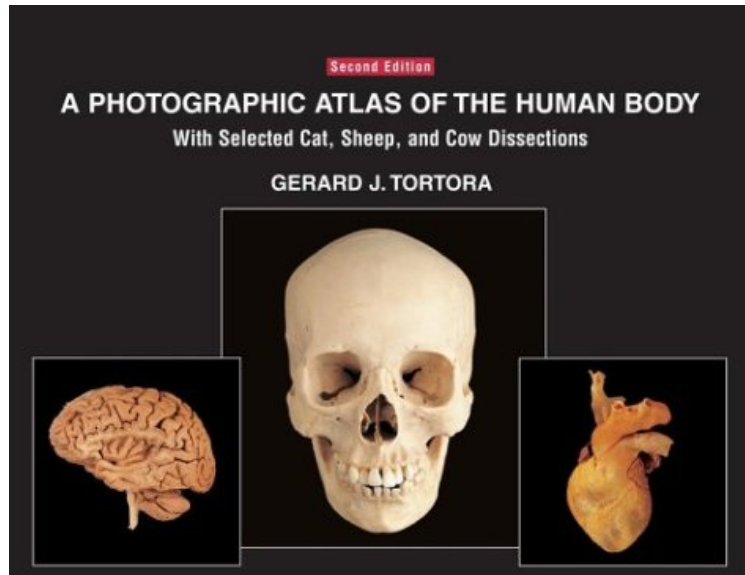

It would be an insult to those who donated their bodies for such an endeavor to possess this book. In that case, it would do you best to get an actual atlas that was dedicated to human-only study. If, however, you are interested in veterinary studies, then this might suit you well. I used this book for a non-human-cadaver anatomy course and it served me well. When I moved into cadaver study, my textbooks reflected such a transition. The takeaway: buy this book if you are not in a cadaver lab or if you are in veterinary studies.
