I was a cab driver at the time, having dropped out of Medical School a few years previously. He graciously allowed me to take the course as an auditing student with other full time medical students, as I was fascinated by human anatomy and wanted to prove to myself that I could do well in it. He was a great character and such a fun, but rigorous teacher. In our dissections my lab mates and I would debate whether to ask him any questions because he would quickly come over and destroy our meticulous dissections with his blunt probe in order to exhibit certain structures. After our first major comprehensive exam he announced to the class that the person who scored the highest was a cab driver auditing the course in the back of the lab.I have been looking for this book for a long time. Excellent Embryology TextBy Jeffrey BurchThe Anatomical Primer by David Langebartel is an exceptional embryology book. It is the pinnacle publication in the study of structural embryology.

Embryology got under way in the late 19th century with the dissection of lot of fetuses. By the 1970s Human embryology was well understood in this structural sense. Around 1960 embryologists turned their attention to gene expression, the timing of when the production of each protein in the body turns on and turns off. By the time Langebartel's book was published few people were interested because gene expression was the hot new thing. Because of this few copies of The Anatomical Primer were ever sold. In human embryology books written since then the structural information has grown progressively poorer, and errors have crept in because the younger authors largely did their PHDs working with gene expression not dissecting fetuses. The Anatomical Primer is a thorough, well written, wonderfully illustrated structural embryology text. 3 of 3 people found the following review helpful. Best Book in Med School!
