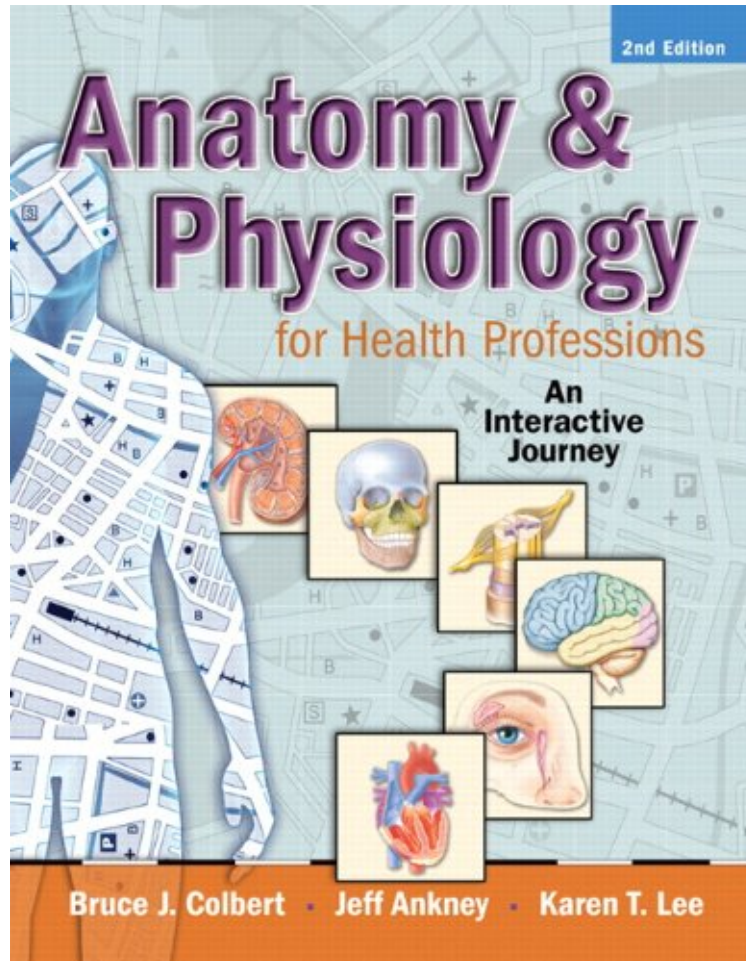

I am 3/4 of the way though the AHIMA AP course, and I can attest that this is indeed the correct textbook to use. Might I suggest though that, if you can find it, that you also order the AP 2nd Edition workbook to accompany the textbook. The soft-bound workbook is also titled, "Anatomy Physiology for Health Professions:..." with the words "Workbook to Accompany" written above that at the top of the book cover. This

workbook is written by the same author (Bruce J. Colbert), published by Pearson, and is meant to compliment and supplement the main textbook. I would also highly recommend that you make sure that the AP textbook that you purchase includes the accompanying AP CD. This invaluable learning tool includes learning games, chapter review quizzes and other media helps that you will use as you go through each and every chapter of the textbook. It is not very often that I honestly feel that I can't put a book down - but this is one of those times! Let me start by saying what this book is not, so that you don't become disappointed when your book arrives. This is NOT a highly technical text that a pre-med student would take (I have one child like that, and saw his college texts). It is not cutting edge. It is not slick. It is not for those who are looking to keep their child pure, because there are photos of the entire anatomy and every biological process. As for what it is ~ it is engaging. It is easy to understand. It explains things clearly. It is economical in words, time, and monetary cost. It is an introduction to A P that seeks to explain things to a lay person. While there is a lot of vocabulary, it is not all consuming. Why only 4 stars then? Simple ~ no labs are given and no lab manual is available for purchase. You will have to go elsewhere for that, unfortunately. Buy a copy that includes the CD. The CD has many videos, games, etc. that are as enjoyable as they are educational. You may have to download an OLD version of Quicktime for a spare computer as it isn't happy with the newer versions. I downloaded version 6 and that works fine. As for student age, I might suggest grades 8-12, depending upon the student's level of interest and commitment. It might be nice to have a foundation in biology first, but chemistry would be unnecessary. I believe that this text is used at community colleges for those interested in allied health science fields.
