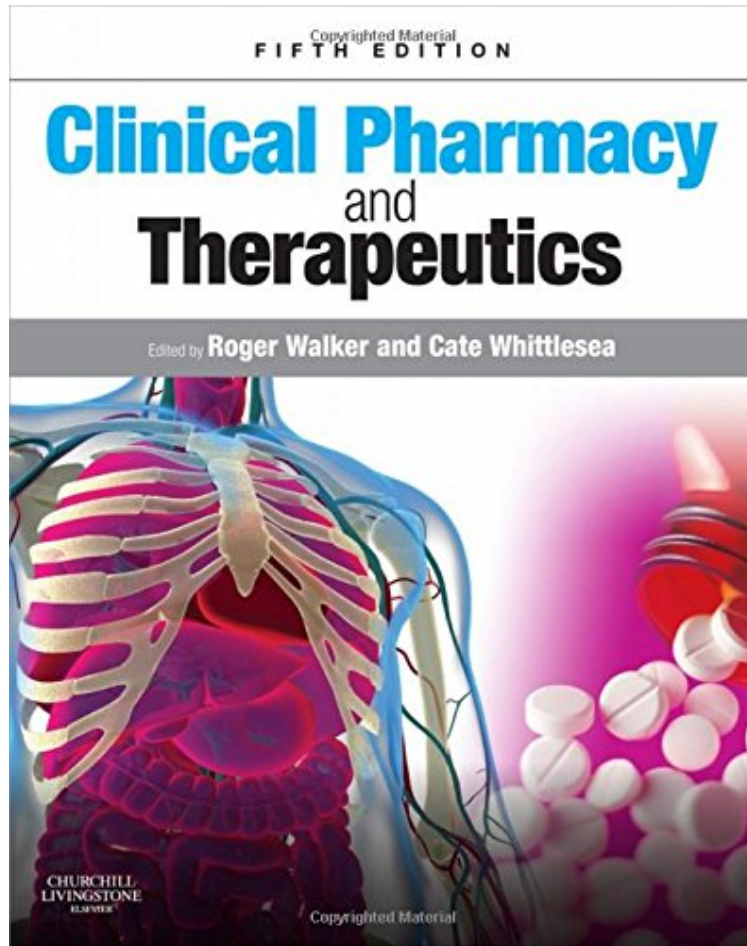

This book's narrative approach to clinical drug therapeutics is both informative and pleasurable to read. There are very few medical texts that I actually look forward to reading, and this has definitely made the list along with Katzung's Basic and Clinical Pharmacology, Reinhart's Statistics Done Wrong and Southwick's Infectious Disease: A Clinical Short Course. I really love this book, but must mention its biggest downfall for an American audience. This is a British book, which means that lab value units of measure often differ with their US counterparts, and the same is true for many of the generic drug names.

The authors integrate an understanding of the disease processes with an appreciation of pathophysiological processes, clinical pharmacy and the evidence base.
